PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- The parliamentary group president positions the CSV in the debates on the state budget:
 - For 2026, Laurent highlighted that the budget supports the weakest in our society through targeted and more effective social measures. In addition, the country's future viability is also strengthened through high investments in infrastructure, in education, the environment, digitalisation and innovation. He therefore links the social, economic and ecological responsibility of the State. The public debt remains stable in relation to economic strength – the budget is therefore sustainable and works for the coming generations
- As president of the Institutions Committee, Laurent deals with legal-constitutional questions:
 - He is a member of the working group on the status of the Member of Parliament
 - He moderates the discussions on the reform of the electoral law
 - For the CSV, the Chamber is the country's first citizens' council and the CSV prefers an open dialogue with citizens rather than creating further institutions
 - He would gladly introduce the possibility of electronic voting
- As spokesperson for foreign policy, Laurent has represented the CSV position on the war in Ukraine and on the conflicts in the Middle East in times of "Trumpism". The CSV stands by Israel's right to exist and for a democratic and free Palestine. The CSV stands on the side of the democratic movement in Iran and has advocated for the classification of the "Revolutionary Guards" as a terrorist organisation

Justice and institutions will be the main priorities of his work in the Chamber.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Diane Adehm served as rapporteur of the budget in 2023. As Chair of the Committee for Finance, she speaks every year on the budget, particularly on the economic aspects, and she is the main spokesperson for legislative projects in the financial and tax fields such as:
 - The tax relief package which adjusted the tax scale and provided further relief for several tax classes
 - In the fintech sector, crypto-assets were regulated
 - The so-called “bëllegen Akt” remains permanently set at 40,000 euros
 - With the AI supercomputer MeluXina-AI and the AI Factory, further key building blocks were established for the development of artificial intelligence
- Other important laws for which she served as rapporteur:
 - The housing package to relaunch the housing market
 - The new digital recruitment system in the public service
 - Virginity certificates and examinations will become punishable offences in the future, and the three-day reflection period before an abortion will be abolished
 - Men and women must each hold at least 33% of decision-making positions in Luxembourg companies listed on the stock exchange
- She also represented the CSV’s positions in parliamentary debates:
 - on financial education, on online banking fraud, on the future of the financial centre

In 2027, she will serve as rapporteur for the law introducing a single tax class with tax relief for all families.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As President of the Luxembourg delegation to the NATO Parliamentary Assembly, Nancy acts as spokesperson in all debates concerning the alliance. Regarding the direction and increase of NATO financial targets, she stresses that no one is eager to increase military spending, but that peace and security do not come for free. Investments in future technologies such as drones and cybersecurity, as well as the financial centre, can play an important role. The aim is not remilitarisation, but to preserve the freedom and security of citizens in Europe
- Nancy is proud that petitions gained strong momentum and popularity under her presidency (until 2023). It is very important to her that politics listens to citizens and allows them to participate in shaping decisions. She is equally proud that the independent support centre for children and victims of sexual abuse, which she had called for in a motion, became a reality and that legislation on sexual abuse has been strengthened accordingly. She emphasises that this topic is no longer a taboo.
- The topics of Nancy’s numerous parliamentary questions mainly concern equality, sport and physical activity at all ages, as well as women’s health and security.

Alongside the topics of health and sport, Nancy will also focus on equal opportunities

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As rapporteur for the 2026 budget, Maurice placed a strong focus on fighting poverty through targeted social policies, particularly the fight against child poverty. Because a policy against child poverty is not charity, but an investment in the future. The aim is to tackle poverty across all ministries. In this context, more than 60 stakeholders were consulted, the budget was analysed, and 16 recommendations were formulated. 15 billion euros, around 46% of state expenditure, are allocated this year to social transfers
- Maurice acted as CSV spokesperson for the implementation of the salary agreement in the public service:
 - An increase of the index point value by 2% in 2025 and 0.5% in 2026
 - Harmonisation of lower career levels
 - Increased interest subsidies for housing loans
- In parliamentary debates on digitalisation, Maurice stressed that digitalisation and artificial intelligence must be priorities for a modern state. It is important to bring every citizen along on this path.

Maurice looks forward to the implementation of the anti-poverty plan with all its projects.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As spokesperson for agriculture and food security, Jeff took the floor in several debates, including those on healthy nutrition and obesity. He served as rapporteur for several laws:
 - The reform of the law on animal diseases helps to prevent outbreaks, detect them earlier and react more quickly
 - ASTA will receive a new building and a new laboratory next to the agricultural school
 - 20 million Euros are allocated to subsidise investments by agricultural farms and larger greenhouses
 - The drinking water supply has been improved through the new SEBES law.
- In the field of energy and energy security, he also acted as spokesperson for important legislation:
 - For photovoltaic subsidies, there is no longer any need to pre-finance the investment; citizens now only pay their share of the investment
 - The government is investing 150 million Euros this year in network costs, helping to lower electricity prices for households, businesses and industry
 - The energy bonus for low-income households has been tripled
- Jeff also spoke for the CSV on other legislative matters:
 - The National Central Purchasing and Logistics Unit for the health sector (CNAL) will bring greater efficiency, lower costs and better stocks of critical equipment
 - The reform of the master craftsman training system opens new opportunities for young people and for those who decide later to pursue a career in trade crafts

His focus will be on expanding renewable energies and energy infrastructure.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As spokesperson on defence policy, Alex was responsible for several pieces of legislation:
 - €816 million will be invested in the second communication satellite GovSat-2
 - The working conditions, recruitment and remuneration of voluntary soldiers, as well as compensation for overseas missions, have been improved
 - He advocated for a strong industrial strategy in the defence sector
- As spokesperson for housing, he addressed several key policy files:
 - For first-time buyers, the “bëllegen Akt” was increased from 30,000 to 40,000 Euros and the deductibility of mortgage interest was adjusted
 - For tenants, a housing bonus for young people starting their professional careers was introduced. The criteria for access to publicly funded housing were revised, and agency fees are now shared between landlord and tenant
 - A €480 million VEFA acquisition programme was launched with the aim of acquiring around 800 housing units until 2027
- Other important parliamentary projects have included and continue to include:
 - The reform of access to the judiciary, enabling the recruitment of more judges
 - In the environmental field, he is rapporteur for the adaptation of the nature protection law, aimed at enabling faster construction of housing and infrastructure in urban areas

Alex will also serve as spokesperson for the reform of juvenile criminal law.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Emile is the long-standing president of the municipal association Syvicol. In this role, he represents not only the interests of municipalities and cities, but above all those of citizens. He stresses that simplifying administrative procedures at all levels of everyday life must be strongly pursued. Excellent service for citizens can only be ensured if municipal services are redefined and further professionalised, and work is ongoing in this area. The planned national building regulation and the reform of the property tax are important steps for progress in housing policy
- As spokesperson for mobility, he welcomes the €1 billion investment in the modernisation and expansion of Luxembourg Airport (Findel). Works are planned on the control tower, the terminal and parking facilities. For passengers, this means greater comfort and improved safety. In addition, residents will receive support if they wish to insulate their homes against noise
 - The law on additional petroleum storage capacity has been adopted
- In the field of public buildings, he spoke on the bill aimed at expanding the Clervaux secondary school:
 - Around €109 million will be invested. The number of students is expected to increase from about 800 to up to 1,580

Emile looks forward to working on further legislation in the areas of transport and road infrastructure, particularly in the north of the country.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Until recently, Félix was President of the Committee on Media and Communication
 - This is where work began on reforming the press law. The main points include introducing specific access to information for journalists, adapting press subsidies, and updating the definition of a professional journalist
 - The new media law was also presented, particularly focusing on reforming media oversight
- Félix Eischen served as CSV spokesperson on the financing of the CFL bus network. A total of €692 million will be invested by 2035. The MP from the South also advocated for restructuring the TICE bus network and securing its funding. He was co-author of a motion calling on the government to safeguard the future of TICE. This motion was supported by all parties in Parliament
- In an opinion article, Félix also expressed his position on the Mercosur trade agreement between the EU and several South American countries. He emphasized that more trade agreements help diversify supply chains. This makes us less dependent on China and the United States and strengthens the EU's resilience. Trade with agreements is preferable to trade without agreements, as they ensure the EU's high standards

Félix will primarily focus on mobility issues and on supporting small and medium-sized enterprises

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Paul is Chair of the Environment Committee and spokesperson for all matters relating to climate policy and nature conservation
 - He served as rapporteur on the extension of the law on “Klimabonus” subsidies for photovoltaic systems and heat pumps, as well as on a socially fair adjustment of the Klimabonus mobility scheme
 - The new tram depot at Cloche d’Or, which will also connect to the fast tram, is a visionary project for the future, particularly in terms of sustainability, he emphasized in Parliament
 - The World Climate Conference is an important meeting for him. He is critical that the high expectations for COP30 were not met. Other topics such as nature, biodiversity and desertification deserve more attention
 - According to him, cooperation and development policy can also set important priorities in education, democratic development and climate change
- As CSV spokesperson for the most disadvantaged in society, he approved the national anti-poverty plan
- As alderman for education in Luxembourg City, he frequently speaks about school-related activities: children should be free, happy and strong, and also be allowed to remain children – extracurricular activities outside primary school are important. He is concerned about violence in schools and initiated a parliamentary debate on this issue

Paul will place emphasis on the National Climate Plan and on the social compensation measures linked to the CO₂ tax.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- The pension reform was prepared over 18 months through broad consultation. The aim was to develop a common foundation ensuring a balance between security, sustainability, and the preservation of its social foundations. Françoise served as rapporteur for these measures:
 - The required duration of insurance is slightly and gradually increased in certain cases
 - Study years are recognised more flexibly
 - In the private sector, the option of a progressive pension is introduced
 - Contributions are increased by half a percentage point for employees, the state, and employers
- In the healthcare sector a, reforms were carried out for which Françoise acted as spokesperson:
 - So-called nicotine pouches are not banned but regulated. Nicotine content is limited, sales to minors are prohibited, and the market is controlled
 - The hospital planning law provides for 200 additional beds
 - Hospitals can now also carry out minor dermatological and ophthalmological procedures at their additional outpatient sites
- She has also frequently taken the floor in Parliament:
 - On the impact of climate change on the labour market
 - On the National Health Plan
 - On public health

Françoise will place particular emphasis on preserving a solidarity-based healthcare system.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Marc has been committed for many years to the redevelopment of the Howald ZAC
 - He acted as spokesperson when an additional €32.5 million was approved for the development of the interchange hub at the Howald peripheral station, as well as for the expansion of the tram network. This represents a milestone in public transport, he explained
 - A long-standing priority for the former mayor of Hesperange remains the Hesperange bypass
- In Parliament, he spoke on various investments in the rail network:
 - This government is investing heavily in the country's future, he emphasized. €5.2 billion is being invested in efficient and attractive mobility: €4.77 billion will be invested between 2026 and 2040 in rail infrastructure, as well as in station security, with additional staff to ensure passenger safety
 - Additionally, Bettembourg station will be completely renovated, and the new railway line to Bettembourg is expected to become operational during 2027
- Marc also represented the CSV position on aviation safety:
 - An EU directive was implemented to allow the recording of radio communications and background conversations in the control tower at Findel

Marc will also focus on issues related to municipal and urban development.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Ricardo’s main focus is the education system:
 - Public European schools offer flexibility to some students, but they cannot and should not replace the traditional system
 - He spoke on the ALPHA project, a law introducing literacy in French. This reform aims to ensure greater equality of opportunity. Luxembourgish even gains importance, as secondary subjects are taught in Luxembourgish. Concerns remain about the need for additional classrooms and the transition to secondary school. A clear implementation plan and regular evaluation with reports are essential
 - As a psychologist, mental health is an important topic for him:
 - Ricardo’s proposal to introduce a national hot-line (119), supported by a multidisciplinary team that can respond quickly to people in psychological distress, was unanimously adopted in Parliament
 - Children’s mental health is particularly close to his heart:
 - It is a priority and requires prevention, early detection, and easy access to support services
 - Regarding young people’s access to social media, he calls for a safe framework up to the age of 16 and for reducing this influence. Technology should serve people, not the other way around
- Ricardo will oversee the Youth Protection Law dossier.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Georges was sworn in to Parliament on 20 January 2026. Since then, he has submitted several parliamentary questions, including on the future of the “Gebälshal” in Esch-Belval and on passenger safety in public transport
- During his time as Minister of Labour and Sports, he initiated several projects through the legislative process, some of which have already been adopted. These include extending Sunday work up to 8 hours, adapting employment measures for young people, and enabling unemployment benefit applications to be submitted online. As Minister of Sports, Georges more than doubled the budget, increasing it from €41 million under his predecessor to €87 million for 2026
- Georges has become rapporteur for a bill implementing the salary agreement in the public service. This involves ensuring that state employees are also subject to the disciplinary regime of the civil service. He will also serve as rapporteur for the new press law

Georges will place a particular focus on social security.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Octavie is responsible for dossiers related to SMEs:
 - Aid measures were adopted to enable small and medium-sized enterprises to invest in research
 - The agricultural law was adapted regarding the status of active farmers and winegrowers
 - Access to certain support schemes for farmers and winegrowers was improved
- In the field of culture, she supported several legislative measures:
 - Practical and pragmatic amendments to the heritage protection law, whereby the state now covers the costs of preventive excavations and administrative procedures have been simplified
 - Until 2030, a financial envelope of €180 million is allocated to the Film Fund. This concerns culture and entertainment, but also the country's image and economic diversification
 - The cultural sector is evolving rapidly, and it is important to have accurate data. Therefore, an "Observatoire de la Culture" has been established to better identify needs, challenges, and strengths
- Legislative improvements were also made in the field of digitalisation:
 - The state can now grant targeted support to network operators to extend communication networks even to remote areas. Everyone should have access to high-speed internet
 - Electronic signatures have been introduced for all administrative acts, including between institutions

Research, the University of Luxembourg, administrative simplification, and viticulture are particularly important to Octavie.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Nathalie served as spokesperson on the constitutional revision:
 - The right of every woman to access abortion has been enshrined in the Constitution. Women's self-determination must be protected permanently and independently of political changes, she emphasized. This concerns something fundamental – respect for a woman's decision in a situation of distress
- She also acted as rapporteur for legislation in labour law and domestic policy:
 - The "Skills Plan" aims to address the mismatch between available and required skills in the labour market. More targeted financial incentives have been introduced to support reskilling and upskilling, particularly for those with the lowest qualifications
 - The employment retention plan (Plan de maintien dans l'emploi) benefits from improved support through the Economic Committee and stronger financing via the Employment Fund
 - The reform of the system determining municipal contributions to the Employment Fund increases solidarity
- Nathalie is also CSV spokesperson for family, integration and equality issues:
 - In the fight against poverty, a subsidy has been introduced for people who cannot afford a retirement home. Housing, as well as essential services such as laundry, telephone or television, are guaranteed

Nathalie will place particular emphasis on the implementation of various action plans, such as those addressing poverty, gender-based violence and anti-racism.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Laurent is CSV spokesperson for security policy and justice:
 - He served as rapporteur for the law introducing local policing. This strengthens proximity between the police and citizens and enhances prevention
 - In cases of serious crime, imprisonment is now the rule and suspended sentences the exception, with judges required to justify such decisions
 - The fight against money laundering has been strengthened
 - Surveillance measures in cases of suspicion have been expanded
 - Under the so-called “mini-investigation” procedure, processes are shortened and the scope of application broadened
- To keep the financial centre attractive, it is not only necessary to attract talent from abroad but also to retain talent within the country, Laurent emphasizes:
 - The so-called “carried interest”, a specific tax regime for fund managers participating in fund performance, is intended to support this
 - Private individuals can now benefit from a new tax credit if they wish to support young and innovative start-ups
- Laurent has also spoken in numerous debates, such as those on the Google data centre and gambling, and has asked many questions about the financial centre, crime and tax policy

He will continue to closely monitor the areas of finance and economy, justice and security.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Jean-Paul served as spokesperson for the law on music education, which was revised:
 - He welcomed the fact that municipalities will receive better financial support in the future and that school organisation as well as the range of courses will be adapted. This will place the valuable music education on a more solid footing, Jean-Paul emphasized. It represents educational, social and cultural policy, as well as an investment in people in the country
 - He will act as rapporteur on the new library law
- He also spoke on behalf of the CSV regarding the new regulation on petitions: A new quorum of 5,500 signatures has been introduced, the website has been made more user-friendly, and a procedure to identify petitioners has been implemented. Petitions are an important instrument in the democratic system – with these new rules, the rights of petitioners are strengthened, he emphasized
- Through numerous parliamentary questions, Jean-Paul repeatedly highlights critical issues, particularly in the North: road infrastructure, railway lines, archaeological excavations, as well as social and educational infrastructure are among his key concerns

Jean-Paul will place particular emphasis on family policy dossiers.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As CSV spokesperson for sports and labour, he served as rapporteur for the law on Sunday work in the retail sector
 - After extensive discussions with social partners, a compromise was reached. In companies with fewer than 30 employees, work can extend up to 8 hours, while in larger companies this must be regulated through collective agreements. Social dialogue remains an absolute "must," Charles emphasized
 - Sport represents an investment in our health; therefore, stronger investment in sports clubs and volunteering is needed. Volunteers are the backbone of the sports sector
- As chair of the special committee on the Caritas scandal, Charles led the work and hearings to ensure that the necessary conclusions could be drawn in the final report. It was important that national activities continued and that the hundreds of jobs were preserved within the new HUT structure
- He also spoke on several justice-related dossiers:
 - Adoption law was reformed – unmarried couples and single individuals can now adopt a child
 - The justice system has been equipped with more effective tools to tackle serious crime in a more targeted and efficient way

Charles looks forward to working on further major dossiers in the areas of labour and justice.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Stéphanie served as rapporteur for a number of laws from the Ministry of Home Affairs and in consumer protection:
 - With the reform of the municipal planning law, more affordable housing must be created in new neighbourhoods and transferred into public ownership
 - 400 police officers had their secondary school diploma recognised retroactively to August 2018 and were reclassified into group B1 by law
 - The reform of police video surveillance (VISU-POL) makes the use of cameras in public spaces easier, faster and more effective
 - The law on class actions provides consumers with a new way to take joint legal action against companies
 - Food safety controls by the ALVA have been given a new legal framework
 - She also spoke on legislation on the economy and labour:
 - Opening hours in retail and food-related crafts have been extended
 - Support schemes for businesses to invest in climate and environmental protection have been expanded
 - At ADEM, more procedures are being digitalised, making them faster and more secure – unemployment benefits can now also be applied for online
 - Labour law has been amended in several areas to make employment measures for young people more attractive
 - In the field of justice, Stéphanie spoke on the reform of the prison system
- Stéphanie will notably act as rapporteur for the implementation of the asylum package.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- Michel served as rapporteur for several tax laws, particularly double taxation agreements with many countries. He also presented legislative changes complementing the pension reform:
 - From 2026, a tax allowance of 750 Euros per month (maximum 9,000 Euros per year) is introduced for employees who voluntarily continue working despite being eligible for retirement. The aim is to encourage longer participation in the workforce and bring the effective retirement age closer to the statutory age of 65
 - The tax-deductible ceiling for private supplementary pension insurance is increased from 3,200 to 4,500 Euros per year
- As the first country in Europe, Luxembourg issued a so-called “Defence Bond” – a law for which Michel acted as rapporteur in Parliament:
 - Part of defence spending will be financed through this government bond amounting to 150 million Euros. Citizens can invest in these bonds, and the interest is tax-free
- Michel was also a driving force behind taking a clear stance in favour of maintaining and strengthening the solidarity-based healthcare system. A multi-tier system will not be introduced in Luxembourg: no to two-tier healthcare

Michel’s priorities will focus on tax policy.

PARLIAMENTARY WORK:

- As Speaker of the Parliament and first citizen of the country, Claude must adopt a neutral position. He votes on laws as a member of the CSV parliamentary group but does not take positions himself in plenary debates. Abroad as well, he represents all members of Parliament, regardless of political affiliation
- He sees the Chamber as an institution that must continuously adapt to change. Faster and fully transparent decision-making, more dynamic and engaging debates – these are the expectations of citizens today. There is a time to debate and a time to decide, Claude emphasizes, and the entire process must be fully transparent. With this in mind, he has already initiated several reforms:
 - Speaking times have been shortened
 - Almost all committee meetings are now broadcast publicly
 - The transparency register has been clarified to show who seeks to influence MPs
 - From 2026 onwards, parliamentary group finances will be audited by the Court of Auditors
 - The scientific unit has been strengthened to support MPs with research
 - A Visitors’ Center is being created in the Gilly House

Still under discussion are new forms of citizen participation, the status of MPs in connection with the issue of holding multiple mandates, and a series of reforms to the electoral law to adapt it to today’s realities.
